The Borough Office is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. We invite you to call or stop in with questions or concerns.

Borough Meetings: Regular meetings are held the 2nd & 4th Mondays of the month and take place in the Avon Municipal Building at 7:30 p.m. Caucus Meetings are held at 7:00 p.m. on the same evenings as regular meetings.

Beach Badges: Season Badges are \$90.00. Senior Citizen Badges (age 65 & over) are \$45.00 and Young Adult Badges (ages 12-18) are \$45.00. Daily badges will be \$9.00 for adults. Beach opens weekends beginning Memorial Day weekend and full time on June 16th. Badges will be sold in the Borough Office beginning May 1st from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and at the beach on weekends beginning Memorial Day weekend and everyday beginning June 16th. The beach is open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Projects: By the time you receive this newsletter the 3rd Ave. and 4th Ave. paving and curb project will have been completed. The Water Tower is in the process of being painted both inside and out and will be completed in time to switch over to Borough well water in early May. Our ongoing project to upgrade and repair our sanitary sewer system will continue this fall with improvements scheduled for Sylvania Lane from Marine Place to 1st Ave., East End Ave., Garfield Lane from 3rd Ave. to 2nd Ave. and Lincoln Lane from 3rd Ave. to 2nd Ave. The lanes that had the sewers repaired last year are scheduled to be paved this fall, Norwood Lane from 4th Ave. to 5th Ave., Woodland Lane from 3rd to 5th Ave., Garfield Lane from Patriot Lane to 2nd Ave. and Lincoln Lane from Ocean Ave. to 1st Ave. The Municipal Pool is in the process of being wet blasted and new tile lanes and a white plaster finish inside the entire pool and kiddie pool will be finished in time for the opening in June. Additional Beach Accessibility Mats have been purchased for the beach entrances that did not have them last year. The Marina project is in full swing with a new bulkhead scheduled for this spring and dredging and pilings for new docks scheduled for the summer. If all goes well the Borough hopes to break ground for the new 2 story all purpose building this fall. Very exciting!!!

Grants: Grant Coordinator-Barbara Suchecki

Beach: New floors were installed in all boardwalk bathrooms over the winter with funding received from a Monmouth County Community Development Block Grant. The Pavilion had new windows installed in April thanks to two preservation grants received from the Monmouth County Historical Commission.

Riverfront Park and Marina: The Borough received approval for a \$250,000 Monmouth County Open Space Grant to be used to establish the park and offset the cost of the building. In addition, we were awarded a Monmouth County Community Development Block grant in the amount of \$132,841 that will be used towards the bathrooms, elevator and handicap access

components of the building. In February, we were notified that the Borough will receive \$300,000 from the NJ DOT IBoatNJ program for the bulkhead at the marina.

Other projects: The Borough received \$26,163 to purchase RIT equipment for the fire department and training from an Assistance to Firefighters grant.

Trash: The Department of Public Works and Sanitation is on their summer schedule. Have your trash out **BEFORE** 6:00 a.m. on the day of pick-up. For those residents that have access to a lane, put your trash there. For those of you who are "walk-ins," do not put your trash out any earlier than 24 hours. **Trash pickup is twice a week on Mondays and Thursdays for the whole town.**

ALL GARBAGE MUST BE IN CANS WITH LIDS PER BOROUGH ORDINANCE!

NOTICE: GARBAGE AND RECYCLING CANS MUST **NOT** BE OVER 32 GALLONS IN SIZE. OVERSIZED CANS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP. As per Ord. 107-7.A

Recycling pick-up is on the First and Third Wednesdays of each month for the entire town.

Holiday Pick-Up for Recycling: Fourth of July: Tues., July 3rd

Put your recyclables out the night before - the men start early in the morning. Your recyclables must be in the lane and separate from trash cans or, if you are a walk-in, put at the curb in proper containers where they are easily seen. Please remove lids on collection day. Mark your containers with an "R" or "Recycling" and pull them out to the edge of the street so they are easily identified as recyclables. Newspapers must be tied in bundles. We do not pick up residential cardboard, junk mail or magazines. Please bring cardboard, junk mail and magazines to the recycling center. The cardboard must be broken down and tied in bundles. We pick up cardboard from businesses only. Please remember that **GLASS MEANS BOTTLES ONLY**. It does not include drinking glasses, dishes, plate glass, windows, light bulbs, etc. These items belong in the garbage. The recycling drop-off center is located at the Public Works Yard. **It is open Monday through Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.** Drop-off center is closed on holidays. Things that are accepted: glass bottles, tin cans, plastic bottles, aluminum cans and newspapers, cardboard and junk mail. PLEASE, this recycling area is for **AVON RESIDENTS ONLY & FOR RECYCLABLES ONLY! NO TRASH OR GARBAGE OF ANY KIND!!!!** **PLEASE PARK IN THE DESIGNATED AREA ONLY. DO NOT LEAVE THINGS OUTSIDE THE GATE!**

MIXED PAPER RECYCLING: You can bring mixed paper to the drop off site. This is voluntary only and there will be **NO** curbside pick-up. Mixed paper and Newspaper **can not** be mixed together. The following outlines the DO's and DON'T's:

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR MIXED PAPER: Magazines/Catalogs, Books (Hard Covers Removed), Junk Mail, Construction Paper, Envelopes with or without windows, Phone Books, Wrapping Paper (non-metallic), NCR (carbonless copy) paper, Letterhead/Colored & White Copy Paper, Fax Paper/Computer Paper, Chipboard (e.g. cereal boxes).

NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR MIXED PAPER: Newsprint, Corrugated Cardboard, Blueprints, Brown Paper Bags, Carbon Paper, Napkins, Tissues & Paper Towels.

GRASS: Should be mulched and left on the lawn. We do not pick up grass. Please do not blow grass into the street. If you prefer to dispose of your grass clippings they can be taken to the Monmouth County Reclamation Center, 6000 Asbury Avenue, Tinton Falls, 732-922-2234.

Leaves: Are to be bagged or canned in the spring, and put out for a separate pickup.

Brush: Will be picked up by Public Works if it is cut into 4-foot lengths and tied in bundles.

Please do not put anything in the street or gutter at any time (except leaves between October 1st and December 1st). **If you have hired a contractor for your landscaping, please notify them that they are responsible for the removal of all grass, brush, branches and any spring and fall cleaning.**

STREET SWEEPING IS ON THE 2ND AND 4TH WEDNESDAY OF EACH MONTH. The North and East sides of the street will be swept on the 2nd Wednesday of each month. The South and West sides of the street will be swept on the 4th Wednesday of each month. The sweeper will start at approximately 6:30 a.m. Please have your vehicle moved to the opposite side of the street on your scheduled day before 6:30 a.m.

Paint and hazardous waste: Paint can only be put out with your regular trash if it is completely dried out and the lids are removed. All other paint and hazardous materials must be taken to the Monmouth County Reclamation Center. Please call 732-922-2234 for appointments and directions. **DO NOT BRING PAINT OR HAZARDOUS MATERIALS TO THE PUBLIC WORKS YARD.**

Do not bring trash or bulk items to the Borough yard! It will be picked up curbside or lane. Please notify Public Works ahead of time.

State Law now prohibits computers and TV's from being disposed of in the trash. They must be recycled. There is an "Avon Residents Only" drop off at the Public Works recycling center. For more information on what to recycle, visit our web site at www.avonbytheseanj.com.

Proof of Residency Policy: Avon Recreation reserves the right to request proof of residency at the time of registration. Please have available an Avon tax bill, water/sewer bill or lease along with your driver’s license when signing up for summer activities.

Refund Policy: There are no cash refunds or credits issued for recreation activities.

FALL SOCCER: Clinics for kindergarten and first grade will begin on Saturday, September 8. Our last scheduled clinic is Saturday, October 27. All clinics are 8:45 – 9:45 a.m. at the Avon field. Cleats and shin guards are recommended, but not required.

Division II (Grades 2-4) and Division I (Grades 5-8) games begin in mid-September. Division I and II players will be contacted in mid-August regarding team rosters and coaches. Registration fee is \$35 per child. Volunteer coaches are needed.

TENNIS: Tennis courts are located at the Jefferson and South Station Avenues. Courts will be utilized on a first come, first served hourly basis. Signs will be posted at the courts outlining general usage and availability. The Avon Public Library’s mission is to serve the public by providing information and materials to meet the educational, personal, and entertainment needs of the community.

The library offers over 20,000 titles for loan, including best sellers, classic novels, book club choices and children’s titles. We have a collection of over 300 DVD movies in the adult and children’s area, and over 3,000 books on CD. We are a member of Jerseycat the statewide interlibrary loan service which allows access to over 580 libraries.

The Avon Public Library was erected in 1916 and is one of only four Carnegie Libraries in Monmouth County, and one of seventeen in the State of New Jersey.

The Police Department has been undergoing many changes throughout the winter. Our dispatch services have been taken over by the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office. When you call the 502-4500 number, if you would like to speak with a dispatcher just press "9". A dispatcher will answer and assist you with whatever your need. If you would like to leave a message for a specific officer, just follow the prompts. If you dial "911" the dispatcher will answer and you can state your emergency, as you have always been able to do. We have also renovated our portion of the Municipal Building. The main entrance has been changed, and that door has been closed. The new entrance is 15 feet to the west of the old entrance. You will need to use the telephone by the entrance to request an officer meet you at the police department and gain access. These changes will not affect any of the current police services that we have provided in the past.

Borough Ordinances:

- I. Dogs: Borough Ordinance 93
 - a. Dogs are not permitted on the beach between May 1st and October 1st. Dogs are never permitted on the boardwalk.
 - b. You must pick up all feces left by dogs.
 - c. Dogs must be on a leash at all times in public

- II. Motor Vehicles: Title 39 and Borough Ordinance 161
 - a. **PARKING ALONG THE FIRST 2 BLOCKS FROM OCEAN AVE CHANGES FROM PARALELL TO DIAGONAL ALONG THE NORTH & EAST SIDES OF THE STREETS ON MAY 1st.**
 - b. The **speed limit** on Borough Streets:
 1. Ocean Avenue drops from 35 MPH to 25 MPH on May 15
 2. Main Street is 30 MPH all year long.
 3. All Lanes, Roosevelt Ave., & McKinley Place are all 10 MPH
 4. All other Avenues are 25 MPH
 - c. Parking is prohibited in all Lanes of the Borough
 - d. No one is permitted to talk or page on a cell phone while driving.
 - e. Please be cognizant of the 4-way Stops along Third Avenue.
 - f. **Bicycles, skateboards, & Rollerblades:**
 1. Anyone under 17 is required to wear a helmet while cycling, roller-skating, in-line skating or skateboarding. This is a State Law
 2. Please secure bicycles in a locked garage, shed, or residence. Make sure you have the bikes locked as well. Each year we have a large number of bicycles stolen. If your bikes are in a locked garage/shed/residence out of sight we can greatly reduce the number of thefts.

- g. We also need you to secure your power tools, surfboards, lawn equipment, and other small items. When left out in the open, these items create an opportunity for would be thieves. If we store items properly, we can greatly reduce the chances of them being stolen.

III. Noise

- a. **Construction** may be done on Monday through Saturday from 8 AM through 5 PM, construction is not permitted on any Federal Holidays.
- b. **Lawn Maintenance**: The operation of a power mower or any other garden power tool is prohibited on Sunday before the hour of 12:00 noon and after the hour of 5:00 p.m. and Monday through Saturday before 8:00 a.m. and after 8:00 p.m. Use of power mowers and power tools by contractors or persons other than the owner or occupant of resident property on Sunday is prohibited.

The Police Department performs “House Checks” for residences in town. If you are going to be away for any period of time and would like the officers to maintain a check on your house, please stop by the Department or call (732) 502-4500 to obtain further information. If anyone sees anything unusual, we ask that you call the Police Department right away at (732) 502-4500. Avon-by-the-Sea First Aid & Safety Squad

The Avon-by-the-Sea First Aid & Safety Squad is a private, non-profit organization that provides emergency medical and rescue services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, for the Borough of Avon and neighboring communities when needed. The Squad answers more than 400 calls for emergency services each year. It has provided these services since 1931.

The Squad is staffed entirely by volunteer EMTs (Emergency Medical Technicians). All EMT training is provided at no cost to the volunteers. Volunteers are always needed and welcome. You must be at least 16 years of age to begin training as an EMT. If you would like to visit the Squad building and find out more about the Squad, you can call 732-502-4519.

We do not charge for any service we provide. The Squad relies upon your generous donations to help pay for our ambulances, fuel, vehicle maintenance, building utilities, first aid supplies, equipment, and training. Our major fund raisers are the annual “Avon 5K Run/Walk” in June and the Fund Drive mailing in July.

Your cooperation is appreciated in taking the following steps to help us assist you in an emergency.

- 1) Display house numbers in a well lit & visible location,
- 2) Keep a list of current medications, medical problems & physician’s name handy,
- 3) Write down phone numbers, “in case of emergency”, & post them by your phone.
